Highlights from the AAHN 42nd Annual Conference


Pre-conference presenters April Matthias, PhD RN, CNE, Anka Roberto, DNP, MPH, APRN, PMHNP-BC, and Kassie Stoffer, MSN, FNP-C The 2025 conference was held in Wilmington, NC from October 16-18. Although uncertainty and concern about recent changes to U.S. immigration policy deterred many international colleagues from traveling to the U.S., we were delighted to feature presenters from Canada, Czechia, Israel, and across the U.S.

Highlights of the conference included the Eleanor Herrman Memorial Lecture, which was delivered by Vanessa Northington Gamble, MD, PhD, Professor of Medical Humanities, George Washington University. Dr. Gamble's talk, which was titled, "'The Field is Open Before Her and Many of Her Sisters': Discovering Early African American Women Physicians," analyzed the experiences of African American women physicians who practiced in the late 19th and early 20th centuries as they navigated race and sex discrimination to craft careers that combined medicine, racial justice, and activism. Dr. Gamble's powerful presentation not only highlighted role of African American women physicians in the history of U.S. healthcare, but also provided important lessons on the critical work historians must do to mitigate archival gaps and silences.

The preconference workshop, led by April Matthias, PhD, RN, CNE, Anka Roberto, DNP, MPH, APRN, PMHNP-BC, FNAP, and Kassie Stoffer, of the University of North Carolina Wilmington shared with participants trauma-informed pedagogical approaches to teaching nursing and healthcare history.

Special thanks to the local arrangements committee led by April Matthias, 2nd Vice President Karen O'Connell and members of the abstract review committee, and to Lisa Held for all their hard work to make the conference a success.






