Essays will be accepted until February 15, 2020 and the winning recipient will be notified by March 30, 2020.

The late Muriel A. Poulin, EdD, RN, FAAN, was a former board member of the Nursing Archives Associates, Professor Emerita at Boston University and one of the authors of the original <u>Magnet Study</u>. An internationally renowned nursing leader and advocate for the nursing profession, she was named a Living Legend by ANA Massachusetts in 2011 and by the American Academy of Nursing in 2012. She was honored by the American Nurses Association by induction into the Nursing Hall of Fame in 2016.
